Eligibility Requirements:

- GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Intending to pursue a degree in Arts and Humanities or humanistic Social Sciences
- Active in the Clinton community

Application Requirements:

- Completed Application Form
- Completed Essay
- Two letters of Recommendation
- Copy of Official Transcript

Recommender Information:

Letters of recommendation should speak to the student's involvement in a school organization, a faith-based organization, or other community organizations and activities, and the positive impacts the students have made through their involvement.
